Seed beads- sizes 6 for the earring and size 10 or 11 for the fringes, both the same color or each size different for contrast.

### Beading thread, size B or Fireline – 6lb test Beading needle to fit your beads 1pair of earwires

scissors, jewelry pliers, work surface, task lamp and magnifiers if you need them. **Call Diana-434-9261** if you have a question.
